



ALVIS HOUSE

FACILITIES AND PROGRAMS



BRESLIN HALL RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

- Located at 971 Bryden Road in Columbus, Ohio, (614)258-1034
- Opened in 1968 as the first Alvis House residential facility
- Named after the first executive director of Alvis House, Maury Breslin
- Houses women under state and local correctional supervision.



PRICE HALL RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAM

- Located at 844 Bryden Road in Columbus, Ohio, (614)252-8405
- Opened in 1972
- Named after staff member and former resident Floyd Eugene Price
- Houses the Wellness Program, which provides long-term substance abuse treatment, and the Reflections Program, which provides treatment for clients with co-occurring mental health and substance abuse disorders.



DUNNING HALL RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

- Located at 868 Bryden Road in Columbus, Ohio, (614)252-1788
- Opened in 1973
- Named after Dr. David Dunning, founder of Alvis House
- Houses women under federal, state and local correctional supervision, also serves women in a specialized state transition program.



WITTWER HALL RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAM

- Located at 624 S. Ohio Avenue in Columbus, Ohio, (614)252-6196
- Opened in 1981
- Named after Pauline Wittwer, benefactress
- Houses and provides specialized, long-term treatment for individuals with Mental Retardation and other Developmental Disabilities.



COPE CENTER RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

- Located at 42 Arnold Place in Dayton, Ohio, (937)278-8219
- Acquired by Alvis House in 1991, has been in operation since 1976
- Provides transitional programs and services for men and women under federal, state and local correctional supervision.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICES

- Located at 1991 Bryden Road in Columbus, Ohio, (614)252-8402
- Opened in 1993
- First building acquired for office use instead of residential programming; houses executive staff offices, human resources and the business office.
- Certified by the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Treatment Services to provide outpatient substance abuse counseling



VETERANS RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

- Located at the VA Medical Center in Chillicothe, Ohio, (740)775-4326
- Opened in 1997
- Specializes in providing transitional services to veterans with post traumatic stress disorder and non-veterans who are under court or correctional supervision.



ALUM CREEK RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

- Located at 1755 Alum Creek Drive in Columbus, Ohio, North: (614)443-4989; South: (614)443-5160
- Opened in 2000
- First halfway house designed & constructed from the ground up in Franklin County
- Provides comprehensive reentry services to individuals who are under federal, state and local correctional supervision.



OHIOLINK CORRECTIONS & TREATMENT, INC. RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

- Located at 2012 Madison Avenue in Toledo, Ohio, (419)241-4308
- Opened in 2000
- Provides transitional programs and services for men and women under federal, state and local correctional supervision.
- Joint venture of the three largest community corrections agencies in Ohio: Alvis House of Columbus, Oriana House of Akron, and Talbert House of Cincinnati. Managed by Alvis House.



REENTRY PROGRAMS: CHILDREN OF INCARCERATED PARENTS - BREAKING THE CYCLE AND YOUNG ADULT REENTRY PROGRAM PROGRAM SERVICES CENTER

- Located at 1780 E. Broad Street in Columbus, Ohio, Reentry Programs: (614)258-9284; Program Services: (614)252-8417
- Houses two family-focused reentry programs: Children of Incarcerated Parents, which addresses the issues facing families when a father is returning home after being incarcerated; and the Young Adult Reentry Program, a program serving older adolescents returning to the community after incarceration.
- Also houses the Program Services Center, which includes employment services, clinical services, substance abuse treatment and cognitive management services.

SUPPORTIVE LIVING PROGRAM

- Alvis House began offering Supported Living services in 2005, (614)252-6196
- Supported Living is a waiver-based program to provide services in consumers' residences. It is funded by the Medicaid Program through the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.
- Alvis House supported living staff provide support and care to increase independent living skills of individuals with Mental Retardation and other Developmental Disabilities.



LONG STREET RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

- Located in downtown Columbus, Ohio, (614)341-6892
- Opened in 2007
- Primarily provides programs and services to Transitional Control clients referred by the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction.



OHIO FATHERHOOD INITIATIVE PROGRAM AND INTAKE SERVICES CENTER

- Located at 538 E. Rich Street in Columbus, Ohio, (614)223-1499
- Opened in 2008
- The Ohio Fatherhood Initiative provides services to fathers who have been incarcerated and are seeking to strengthen family ties and learn new parenting skills.
- Also houses the Intake Services Center, which reviews client admissions and places clients into the Alvis House programs that will best meet their needs.



COMMUNITY CONNECTION - REENTRY SERVICES CENTER

- Located at 993 E. Main Street in Columbus, Ohio, (614)252-0660
- Acquired by Alvis House in 2008, Community Connection has been providing reentry services since 1971.
- Provides nonresidential reentry services, such as employment readiness and job placement, case management, GED instruction, life skills education, and support services to assist individuals in successfully reentering the community.



COMMUNITY CONNECTION - LIMA

- Located at 330 N. Elizabeth Street in Lima, Ohio, (419)225-8793
- Acquired by Alvis House in 2008, has been in operation since 1999
- Provides reentry services, clinical treatment services and counseling to outpatient clients.
- Provides educational and life skills instructional services via videoconferencing to individuals who are currently incarcerated and working toward making a successful transition to the community.
